WHAT IS COOPERATIVE?



Article 3 of RA 9520

A cooperative is an autonomous and duly registered association of persons, with a common bond of interest, who have voluntarily joined together to achieve their social, economic, and cultural needs and aspirations by making equitable contributions to the capital required, patronizing their products and services and accepting a fair share of the risks and benefits of the undertaking in accordance with universally accepted cooperative principles.



Cooperative Principles:

1. Voluntary and Open membership
2. Democratic Member Control
3. Member Economic Participation
4. Autonomy and Independence
5. Education, Training and information
6. Cooperation among Cooperatives
7. Concern for Community.

CATEGORIES of COOPERATIVES

- **Primary Cooperatives**
Members of which are natural persons
- **Secondary Cooperatives**
Members are juridical persons such as primary cooperatives.
- **Tertiary Cooperatives**
Members of which are secondary cooperatives upwards to one more apex organizations which shall be known as Federations or Unions as the case maybe.

ORGANIZATION and MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE

OFFICERS OF COOPERATIVE

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- 1. Members of the Board of Directors** - Composed of not less than five (5) nor more than fifteen (15) members elected by the general assembly for a term fixed in the by-laws but not exceeding a term of two (2) years.

-Strategic planning, direction setting, Policy formulation in the coop

- 1. Chairman- He presides over the meeting of the BOD**
- 2. Vice Chairman- Performs the function of the Chairman in his absence**

OFFICERS OF COOPERATIVE

2. Secretary

Keep an updated and complete registry of all members;

- Record, prepare and maintain records of all minutes of meetings of the BOD and the GA;
- Ensure that the necessary actions and decisions of the BOD are transmitted to the management for compliance and implementation.

3. Treasurer - Ensure that all cash collections are deposited in accordance with the policies set by the Board of Directors

OFFICERS OF COOPERATIVE

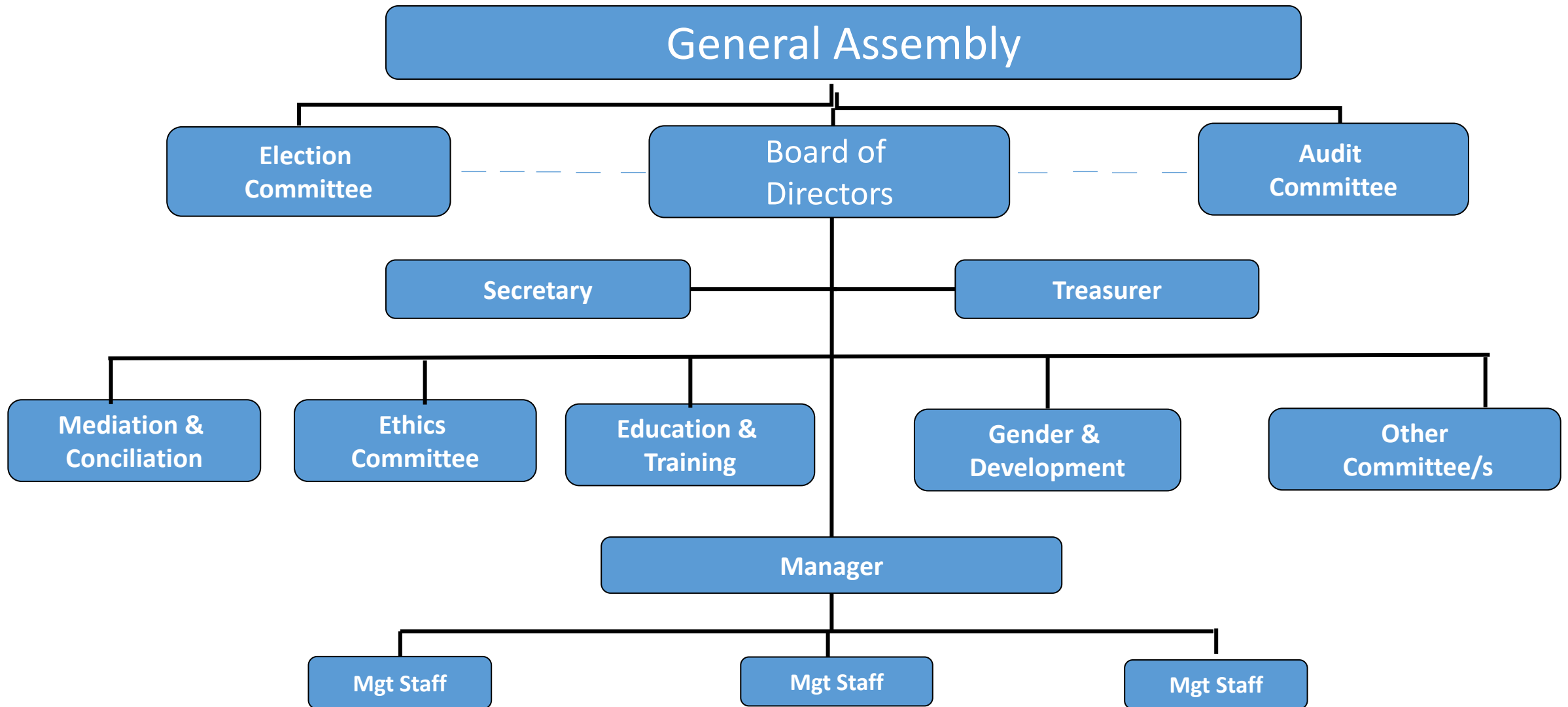
4. MEMBERS OF DIFFERENT COMMITTEE CREATED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

5. General Manager – Oversee the overall day to day business operations of the cooperative by providing general direction, supervision, management and administrative control over all the operating departments of the cooperative

The By-Laws shall provide for the creation of the following committees:

- Audit Committee - elected by the GA
- Election Committee - elected by the GA
- Education & Training Committee - appointed by the BOD
- Mediation/Conciliation Committee – appointed by the BOD
- Ethics Committee - appointed by the BOD
- Gender and Development Committee – appointed by the BOD
- Other committees necessary for the conduct of the affairs of the cooperative
(e.g. Credit committee)
